FROM OUR PASTOR

There has been much talk among Christians in our country about shifting the focus of how we see "Church." In years past, most congregations could have been described as Consumer Churches—congregations in which members see the

church as a dispenser of religious goods and services. People, in this model, attend worship to be fed. Members expect quality programs to meet their needs. A common refrain is, "I go to church."

But a powerful shift is happening among Christian congregations. We are moving to a missional focus. Missional churches see themselves as a body of people sent on a mission into the community and world. These folk gather regularly for worship, encouragement and teaching of the Word. Missional Christians are spiritually fed throughout the week by on-going spiritual disciplines: Bible study, meditation, small groups, art, and service. A common refrain among missional Christians is, "I am the church."

At St. Paul UCC, we are the church. We are focused beyond our four walls to bring hope and light to others. My prayer is that we continue to "be the church" rather than "coming to church."

You are invited to join us at church each weekend and throughout the week. On the weekend of September 7 and 8, the Membership Team will be hosting significant fellowship times following both worship services to offer each of us the opportunity to be the church for one another. Homecoming Weekend is a terrific time to "come home."

If you have been away from St. Paul Church for a summer or a year or two (or more), you are warmly invited to come home. God is still speaking in our congregation—in the laughter of our children, in the songs of our youth, in the passion of our Mission Team, in the diligence of our Council, and in hundreds of other ways.

Indeed, we are the church together!
